

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF ORGANIZATIONS THAT PURCHASE THE TAXONOMY

If your organization has purchased a subscription *A Taxonomy of Human Services: A Conceptual Framework with Standardized Terminology and Definitions for the Field* from INFO LINE of Los Angeles, you are entitled to do the following as a holder of a legal license for the *Taxonomy*:

1. Use the *Taxonomy* including codes, terms, definitions, see also references and use references as a classification structure for your resource information database.
2. Use *Taxonomy* terms in a survey instrument to collect information from the organizations you wish to include in your information file. You may only include *Taxonomy* terms that you have used to index records in your database.
3. Use *Taxonomy* terms as an index in any printed or electronic directory of services developed by you and distributed to others. You may only include *Taxonomy* terms that you have used to index records in your database and any higher level terms on the same branch that are needed to display the hierarchical structure.
4. Use *Taxonomy* terms as an index in a read-only version of your software that you use to distribute your information database in searchable format. "Read only" means that database information, including the *Taxonomy*, cannot be altered (updated, deleted, added to etc.) by the end user. You may only include *Taxonomy* terms that you have used in your database and any higher level terms on the same branch that are needed to display the hierarchical structure.
5. Include *Taxonomy* definitions in your directory or read-only software, but only for those terms you have used to index records in your information database and/or entries in your directory. You may not include definitions for terms not used in your directory/database.
6. Use *Taxonomy* terms to index resources that you make available to others via the Internet. You may include *Taxonomy* definitions, but only for terms you have used in your information database. You may not include terms or definitions for services not used in your database.

You are licensed to use the *Taxonomy* as an indexing and searching tool for your database and make it available to your end users on that basis. Changes and additions to the *Taxonomy* accessed by you as a subscriber must be incorporated in your database by you and distributed in the context of your database to your end users. Under no circumstances are you permitted to distribute the *Taxonomy* as a separate product or module or make it available to end users as a "downloadable" file separate from your information database or in a read/write version of your software in which *Taxonomy* data can be printed, downloaded or modified. Organizations wanting access to the full *Taxonomy* as a separate product must purchase their own subscription from INFO LINE of Los Angeles.

Whenever terminology and definitions from the *Taxonomy* are utilized in a published or electronic directory or database (including Internet applications), you must prominently display a notice that indicates that the terms, codes, definitions, see also references and use references are copyrighted materials reproduced by permission from INFO LINE of Los Angeles and cannot be reprinted without similar permission. Use the following notice:
